Madrid, 20 March 2020 — Endesa Educa, an environmental education project by the Endesa Foundation, makes available to families, teachers and students a large collection of online educational resources, totally free. With them, now that you have to stay at home, you can learn about the world of energy and caring for the environment while having fun.

The extensive online material available at <u>Endesa Educa</u> offers, in addition to some very useful information, a wide variety of virtual activities and multimedia content in the form of games and experiments.

This knowledge can also be complemented **on the Endesa Educa blog and YouTube channel**.

In addition, the programme has a platform, <u>Endesa Educa Digital</u>, which is closely tied to what is taught in the 3rd and 4th year of primary school and where **teachers and students can participate in an online game** that presents them with energy missions and challenges with one final goal: to save the planet.

Endesa Educa was started 20 years ago with the aim of spreading knowledge about energy and sustainability in a dynamic and entertaining way and showing how the world of energy works, from the generation of resources to its efficient and rational use. **More than 45,000 children and young people use it every year.**

Its activities are not only digital but also include face-to-face sessions in schools and visits to company facilities, although these last two types of activity were suspended at the beginning of March, for obvious reasons of prudence, as a consequence of the Covid-19 epidemic.
