



BIODIVERSITY POLICY

Endesa considers the protection of biodiversity as a priority aspect of its business strategy and is fully aware of the risks derived from its loss. Therefore, biodiversity protection was already included in its first environmental policy approved and published in 1998. Now with the biodiversity policy, the Company reinforces and strengthens its engagement, committing to:

- Evaluate the relationship between Edesa's activity and natural capital, understanding natural capital as a set of all those natural resources that generate ecosystem services and provide benefits to society, including both existing impacts and dependencies.
- Integrate the principles of biodiversity conservation into the company's strategy, including its consideration in decision-making regarding new projects, management and the operation of existing assets.
- Identify, evaluate and put into practice new models and methodologies regarding natural capital and ecosystem services in the Company business management in order to achieve a sustainable economic growth.
- Promote a clear and verifiable biodiversity awareness and knowledge, collaborating with conservation entities, NGOs, local communities, recovery centers, research centers, administrations, universities and experts, in order to conserve and protect it.
- Promote the enhancement of biodiversity, ecosystem services, and knowledge regarding all the activity that Endesa carries out for its conservation.
- Do not operate thermal electricity generation facilities in protected natural areas in the Iberian Peninsula, and do not design or develop new thermal electricity generation facilities in protected natural areas in non-peninsular territories.

This biodiversity policy has been approved by the Board of Directors on January 27 2020
